### ARLINGTON ISD – WEEK TEN PREVIEW

#### DISTRICT 4-6A

 Arlington Colts (4-4, 3-2) at  Martin Warriors (6-2, 5-0)

7:30 p.m. Friday, Maverick Stadium

**THE SERIES:** The Colts lead the series, 20-10-1, but the Warriors have won six of the last eight. Arlington has a 15-5 edge at Maverick Stadium, although the Colts haven't beaten Martin there since 2006.

**LAST WEEK:** Martin broke or tied several city records last week in an 87-20 demolishing of Fort Worth Paschal, while Arlington High fell to Bowie, 42-41. Martin clinched a playoff spot with its win.

**ON THE WARPATH:** When Martin finally stopped scoring last week, the Warriors had re-written the record book. The Warriors' 87 points broke the AISD single game record of 86, set by Martin in last year's Paschal game. Martin also broke the AISD record for points in a quarter, with their 52-point effort in the second quarter. The old record was 47, set by Lamar, against Fort Worth Paschal on Oct. 24, 2003. Martin's 12 touchdowns tied the record it had set in last year's game, and Arlington High had against Handley in 1922.

**GETTING HIS KICKS:** Martin kicker Patrick Grady entered his name in the record book Saturday afternoon by booting 11 extra points, breaking the record of 10, set by Lamar's Doug Dunn against Weatherford in 2008 and Arlington High's Taylor Nelson-Cook against Odessa in 2009.

**MOVIN' ON UP:** Martin's Nick Smith scored three touchdowns in his return to the lineup last week. This gives him 63 career touchdowns, tying him for second in city history with Sam Houston's Jamal Turner. Smith is now just five short of fellow Warrior Danzel Williams' city record of 68.

**THE SERIES:** Lamar leads the series, 11-0, including all five meetings at Kangaroo Stadium. The Vikings have won the 11 meetings by a combined score of 485-137.

**LAST WEEK:** The Vikings knocked off North Crowley, 51-17, while Weatherford blanked Sam Houston, 14-0.

**WHITEWASHED:** Weatherford's shutout of Sam Houston last week was its first since Oct. 6, 2006, when the Kangaroos blanked Fort Worth Paschal, 70-0.

**THE SERIES:** Bowie leads the series, 7-2, and has won the only previous meeting at Handley Field.

**LAST WEEK:** Bowie rallied past Arlington High, 42-41, while Paschal dropped its ninth consecutive district game in being massacred by Martin, 87-20.



**THE COMEBACK:** Bowie's 21-point comeback to beat Arlington High equaled its largest in school history and tied for the second-largest in AISD history. The Volunteers also overcame a 21-point deficit to beat Copperas Cove, 30-27, in overtime on Sept. 6, 2002. The largest comeback in city history was Sam Houston's 25-point comeback over Amarillo Palo Duro in 1990.

**COOK TO THE RESCUE:** Bowie's DeAndre Cook rushed for an AISD record 256 yards in the second half in the Volunteers' victory Friday night. The previous record for rushing yards in a half was 244, set by Lamar's Housen Maxwell against Irving in 2006.

**TOOTHLESS CATS:** Paschal has now lost 39 of its last 41 district games, dating back to 2009. The lone wins in that streak was the Panther's 54-35 triumph over Weatherford in 2013 and their 52-45 win over the Kangaroos last year.
