ARLINGTON ISD – WEEK ELEVEN PREVIEW

DISTRICT 4-6A

 Sam Houston Texans (2-7, 1-5) at  Lamar Vikings (8-1, 5-1)

7 p.m. Thursday, Cravens Field

THE SERIES: The Vikings lead the series, 35-9, and have won the last 13 meetings and 28 of the last 30. Lamar also owns a 14-4 edge at Cravens Field.



LAST WEEK: Lamar smashed Weatherford, 41-14, while Sam Houston was outscored by North Crowley, 34-20.

WELL RECEIVED: Lamar's Kofi Boateng tied the Arlington ISD record for career touchdown receptions with his 24th last week. He equaled the mark set by former Arlington receiver Dontha Robinson from 2010-12.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: Sam Houston hasn't beaten Lamar at Cravens Field since 2001.

 FW Paschal Panthers (3-6, 0-6) at  Arlington Colts (4-5, 3-3)

7 p.m., Thursday, UT-Arlington's Maverick Stadium

THE SERIES: The Colts lead the series, 13-4, and haven't lost to Paschal since 1966. Arlington has won both meetings at Maverick Stadium.

LAST WEEK: Arlington High fell to Martin, 67-49, while Paschal was torched by Bowie, 50-16.



OFFENSIVE PERFORMANCE: The Arlington-Martin game featured 116 points, the third-highest scoring game in Arlington ISD history. The record is 123, set in Martin's 69-54 loss to Allen in last year's playoffs, followed by the 121 points tallied in Bowie's 72-49 win over Dallas Jesuit last year. The Colts tied for the fourth-most points by a losing team in AISD history, ironically equaling their own total in a 56-49 loss to Grapevine in 2005.

TOOTHLESS CATS: Paschal has now lost 10 consecutive and 40 of its last 42 district games, dating back to 2009. The lone wins in that streak was the Panthers' 54-35 triumph over Weatherford in 2013 and their 52-45 win over the Kangaroos last year.

DEFEN-SIEVE: On the surface, the 396 points Paschal has allowed doesn't look so good, but it's an improvement over the 606 the Panthers allowed last year.

 Weatherford Kangaroos (5-4, 3-3) at  Bowie Volunteers (5-4, 4-2)
7 p.m., Thursday, Wilemon Field

THE SERIES: The Volunteers lead the series, 8-0, including both previous meetings at Wilemon Field. The Kangaroos have only scored 60 points in the eight previous meetings, and have never come closer than 10 points against Bowie.

LAST WEEK: Bowie inched closer to a playoff berth with a 50-16 pounding of Fort Worth Paschal, while Weatherford's post-season chances to a hit after a 41-14 loss to Lamar. The Kangaroos would have to beat Bowie by at least 12 points to have a chance.

IN THE (END) ZONE: Bowie's Anthony Hawkins tied a school record last week with four touchdowns against Paschal. Hawkins is the 10th Volunteer to score four touchdowns in a game, the last being DeAndre Cook, who tallied four times against North Crowley three weeks ago.

COOKIN': Bowie's DeAndre Cook became the second player in school history to surpass 3,000 rushing yards last week. Cook, who now has 3,036 career yards, needs 62 this week to pass Russell Hansbrough and become the school's all-time leading rusher and also move into 12th place on the AISD's career rushing list.

RUNNING THE TABLE: Martin is looking for its second consecutive undefeated district season. The Warriors have won 15 consecutive district games, the fourth-longest streak in AISD history.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: Martin's 154 points over the past two weeks establishes a new AISD record for points in back-to-back games. The old record was 139, set by Bowie in consecutive wins over Paschal and North Crowley in 2013.
